The woman the world recognizes as Marilyn Monroe was born Norma Jeane Mortenson, on June 1, 1926, and baptized Norma Jeane Baker. Baker and Mortenson were the surnames of her mother Gladys Baker's two ex-husbands. (Monroe created part of her stage name using Baker's surname at birth, Monroe.) Monroe never knew who her father was.
